Throughout the Library, we will be using QR codes to link to book trailers, book reviews, and to other useful information!

“What is a QR code?” you ask - well, a QR (Quick Response) code is a two-dimensional barcode that can contain URLs, location and contact information, small amounts of text, and other important pieces of information. This information can be retrieved by scanning the QR code using a QR code reader installed on your mobile phone, Smartphone, or tablet. To help get you started, our staff members recommend this QR code scanner app: i-nigma.

You can browse the collection, check out with your library card, and download to PC, Mac®, and many mobile devices and compatible eReaders! To get started, you will need to install free software. For audiobooks, music and videos: OverDrive® Media Console™. To read eBooks, you'll need Adobe® Digital Editions.

Titles can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including iPad®, Barnes and Noble NOOK™, Sony® Reader™, and many others. Some audio titles can also be burned to CD to listen on-the-go. Titles will automatically expire at the end of the lending period. There are no late fees! (Amazon® Kindle™ compatibility is coming soon!)



Playaway is the simplest way to listen to an audiobook on the go. With the audio already contained within, all you need is a battery to make it play and earphones to listen and enjoy. Or if you prefer to listen while you drive, all you need is an auxiliary cable so that you can listen through your car's stereo speakers.
