## LOUISA MAY ALCOTT: THE WOMAN BEHIND *LITTLE WOMEN*

**LOUISA MAY ALCOTT MOTHER-DAUGHTER BOOK CLUB** - On Saturday, November 12-2:00-3:30 p.m. in the Library Program Room we will present a special mother-daughter book discussion for girls ages 11-14 and their mothers, grandmothers, or other caregivers. Join us as we discuss the book *The Mother-Daughter Book Club* by Heather Vogel Frederick. The book is set in Louisa May Alcott's hometown of Concord, Massachusetts and tells the story of four middle school-age girls that must read the book *Little Women* at a book discussion group organized by their mothers. Stop by the Reader's Advisory Desk beginning October 24 to register and pick up a copy of the book. It is not necessary to read the book to attend the discussion.

**IF LOUISA MAY ALCOTT VISITED SANDUSKY** - We will hold a special Brown Bag Lunch on Wednesday, November 16-12:00-1:00 p.m. in the Library Program Room. Join us as we take a look back to 1860s Sandusky through the eyes of a visitor to our community. What would Louisa May Alcott have done in Sandusky? Who would she have visited? What sites would she have seen? Museum Administrator Maggie Marconi will take you on a journey to 1860s Sandusky. Registration is requested but not required. **LOUISA MAY ALCOTT WROTE THAT? THRILLERS AND CIVIL WAR SKETCHES** - Join us on Wednesday, November 16-6:00 p.m. in the Library Program Room for a special book discussion. Alcott is best known for her children's novel *Little Women*, but she authored many books for adults. At this program, Sandy Zagarell will explore My Contraband, the first sketch from *Hospital Sketches* and other short fiction about the Civil War. She will also lead the discussion of Alcott's literary thriller *Behind a Mask*.

**STARTING FROM SKETCH: OHIO ILLUSTRATOR WILL HILLENBRAND** - Thanks to a grant from the Federal Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and the State Library of Ohio, illustrator Will Hillenbrand will be visiting Sandusky Library and Sandusky area preschools. Hillenbrand's visit is part of Choose to Read Ohio, a statewide initiative designed to encourage the reading of Ohio literature. On Thursday evening, November 3, at 6:00 p.m., he will be at Sandusky Library and participating in Downtown Sandusky Art Walk. Hillenbrand will lead a family storytime and demonstrate his drawing. The Erie MetroParks will help preschoolers learn where bears go in the winter. Each family will receive one of Mr. Hillenbrand's books courtesy of the Hearst Foundations. Join us for this fun, inspirational family program. Hillenbrand's goal is to inspire the young artist of tomorrow by showing that art and writing can be a life's venture, not just a hobby. He is the illustrator of many books, including *Sleep, Big Bear, Sleep!* Also on November 3, he will teach early literacy skills to preschoolers and show them how to draw. Hillenbrand will visit Jackson Learning Center of Sandusky Schools and Betty Rinderle Early Childhood Center, where he will give a presentation to preschoolers from Head Start and North Point Educational Center. He will give each child a signed copy of one of his books.

**MEET MARSHA CARRINGTON: CHILDREN'S BOOK ILLUSTRATOR AND ANIMATION ARTIST** - Marsha Gray Carrington is a local illustrator who has illustrated seven children's books, including *Tessa's Tip-Tapping Toes*, *Saving the Liberty Bell*, *Go Home, Mrs. Beekman*, and *Coriander the Contrary Hen*. Marsha's professional background includes working in special effects animation for the film industry for 13 years before she began illustrating children's books, which had been a long-standing dream of hers. Both adults and children are welcome to join Marsha on Monday, November 21, at 6:00 p.m. in the Library Program Room. Her presentation will cover how she got started in the industry, as well as the process of illustrating a children's book, from receiving the manuscript, creating book layouts, rough sketches, final drawings, to final art for publication. Her presentation will also include discussion on working with an agent, editors, and art directors, and she will also be available to answer questions pertaining to the industry. Marsha will have books she has illustrated for sale as well as signed, limited edition prints from her many illustrations. Registration is requested, but not required.
